

**PUBLIC NOTICE
OF INTENT TO RELOCATE INTERMENTS
WITHIN THE MOSELY CEMETERY,
BOYDTON, MECKLENBURG COUNTY**

2. PROPOSED WORK AND NEED FOR RELOCATION

The applicant proposes to build a multi-phase Industrial Park Expansion on a 189 acre parcel to further expand the existing park. The project will consist of several buildings and associated infrastructure.

Pursuant to environmental review of the Industrial Park Expansion project, Mecklenburg County (the County) has completed the identification and evaluation of historic properties {Phase I Archaeological Survey of the Mecklenburg Industrial Park (Dutton and Striker, 2014); Phase II Archaeological Evaluation of the Mosley Cemetery (058-5128 and 44MC0920) Mecklenburg Industrial Park (Dutton and Metz 2014)}. The Mosley Cemetery (44MC0920) has been deemed eligible for, and recommended for inclusion in the National Register of Historic Places. The cemetery contains two identified headstone markers with the following inscriptions: (1) Fred D. son of Stephen & L.A. Moseley, Born Jan. 12, 1904. Died Nov. 27, 1906. Gone but not forgotten. (2) Stephen Moseley. Born Jan. 1870. Died Dec. 1930. Age 60. Gone but not forgotten. An unknown number of unmarked graves also exist within the cemetery.

The County has determined that disturbance of the cemetery cannot be avoided due to the required layout of proposed buildings for the park expansion and their associated infrastructure, and intends to apply for a burial permit through the Virginia Department of Historic Resources (DHR) to allow the archaeological excavation and relocation of the aforementioned cemetery. A copy of this application may be requested from DHR.

The exhumed human remains and funerary objects will be relocated to a public cemetery in Mecklenburg County, unless otherwise denoted by interested parties.
