**7. Description**

**SUMMARY DESCRIPTION**

Located approximately two-and-a-half miles from Washington, D.C., Lyon Park is a residential neighborhood in central Arlington County, Virginia. Lyon Park is bounded by 10<sup>th</sup> Street North to the north, Arlington Boulevard to the east and south, and North Irving Street on the west, with Washington Boulevard and North Pershing Drive bisecting the community. Lyon Park was originally part of the growing community of Clarendon, but eventually became a separate residential neighborhood. In 1919, Frank Lyon subdivided the 300-acre tract that included property purchased by his former partner, Robert Moore, and platted as "Moore's Addition to Clarendon." Each of the original 1,200 building tracts measured approximately fifty-feet in width. At the center of the neighborhood, a parcel of land was set aside as parkland and the site of the community center. After the initial development in 1919, Frank Lyon continued expanding Lyon Park to the east, south, and west, with the final portion platted in 1951. Consequently, the Lyon Park Historic District occupies approximately 284 acres. The streets are mainly perpendicular, laid out in a grid pattern, with intermittent curvilinear streets near the central portion of the neighborhood. Many of the streets are devoid of sidewalks, although most of the lots have driveways and free standing garages.

Lyon Park is defined by a variety of architectural styles, ranging from Craftsman-style bungalows dating from the first decade of development to Colonial Revival-style buildings dating from the second quarter of the twentieth century. The domestic buildings in Lyon Park date from the

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1890s to infill housing built at the turn of the twenty-first century and are constructed of both wood frame and masonry, although the latter dominates. The forms and styles include Queen Anne, Colonial Revival, Tudor Revival, Bungalow/Craftsman, Cape Cods, American Foursquare, and pre-fabricated kit houses. The Colonial Revival style dominates in Lyon Park and the neighborhood now contains one of Arlington County's greatest concentrations of high-style suburban Colonial Revival buildings from the World War I to World War II period (1918–1945). These include single-family dwellings and garden apartment complexes, which are largely confined to Arlington Boulevard. Lyon Park is also home to two churches, a community house and park, and a commercial building core located along the intersection of North Pershing Drive and Washington Boulevard.

**DETAILED DESCRIPTION**

**Development Prior to the Platting of Lyon Park (1900-1919)**

The Queen Anne style was used in the construction of many of the first dwellings in Lyon Park. This style frequently drew on designs from pattern books and was favored for everything from rowhouses to sprawling seaside retreats. All were resplendent in patterned shingles, spindles, brackets, and curlicue cutouts; many boasted ample verandahs, turrets, and sleeping porches. During the latter part of the nineteenth century, the Queen Anne style found an exuberant expression in wood, and frequently incorporated columns and decorative motifs borrowed from our own colonial architecture. The traditional lavish architectural detailing of the Queen Anne style was easily diluted when only selected embellishments were applied. Often, the intricate form commonly associated with the Queen Anne style was the only identifiable element of the fashion. This vernacular interpretation of the style was distinctly prominent in Arlington County, particularly prior to the county's suburban transition in the twentieth century.

One of the most imposing, although vernacular, examples of the Queen Anne style noted in Lyon Park is the dwelling at 916 North Daniel Street, built in 1911. The dwelling exhibits the most common form documented in Arlington County, a rectangular form augmented by a second-story canted bay with an oversize pedimented gable. The wood-frame building is set upon a raised

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foundation with narrow weatherboard cladding. The façade, measuring two bays wide, has a wrap-around porch supported by Tuscan columns. Although Queen Anne in style, the building contains Colonial Revival elements such as a Palladian-like triple window and sidelights, stylistic elements popular at the time the house was constructed. Other Queen Anne-style examples erected prior to the platting of Lyon Park are 903 North Irving Street (1902), 2814 Washington Boulevard (1908), and 713 North Cleveland Street (1910).

**Development of Lyon Park (1919-1953)**

In the second quarter of the twentieth century, the period in which Lyon Park was actively being developed, traditional domestic forms were often interpreted for economy and convenience. The resulting bungalow mimicked the plan and massing traditionally associated with the fashionable Queen Anne style; yet, the bungalow form was invariably one to one-and-a-half stories in height. The bungalow is covered by a low-pitched, intersecting gable roof that encompassed the often wrapping porch. The irregular plan allowed for additional window openings and direct access to the porch from various secondary rooms. The modest arrangement of the wood-frame buildings made them one of the most popular low- to middle-income domestic forms in growing suburban communities like Lyon Park across the United States. The bungalow, very often adorned with elements of the Craftsman style, is one of the more dominant of the domestic forms in Lyon Park. Stylistic elements displayed in the community include rock-faced concrete block foundations, tapered Tuscan posts on masonry piers, full-width front porches, and paired window openings with three vertical lights in the upper sashes. As the popularity of the form was heightened during the second quarter of the twentieth century, the bungalow form of Arlington County was equally embellished with Queen Anne- and Colonial Revival-style detailing. This was noted throughout Lyon Park. Examples of the Craftsman/Bungalow can be seen at 813 North Cleveland Street (1920), 803 North Danville Street (1920), and 815 North Daniel Street (1925).

Another of the popular building forms of the early twentieth century was the American foursquare, commonly ornamented with Colonial Revival- and Craftsman-style detailing. At least six illustrations of the American foursquare exhibiting architectural detailing fashionable in

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the early part of the twentieth century have been documented in Lyon Park, especially along North Fillmore Street, North Cleveland Street, and North 3<sup>rd</sup> Street. The buildings have the characteristically distinguished two-story height, hipped or pyramidal roof with pronounced eaves and dormers that light an extra half-story, a large front porch, and a lack of ornate exterior details. The overall shape of the buildings is a cube, and the main entry openings are located off-center. Examples of the American foursquare form are located at 908 North Daniel Street (1920), 3113 North Pershing Drive (1924), 803 North Cleveland Street (1927) and 209 North Cleveland Street (1928).

One of the most common building practices in Lyon Park, and many other early-twentieth-century subdivisions in Arlington County, was the kit house or mail-order house. The largest, and by far the best known of the mail order companies was Sears, Roebuck and Company of Chicago, Illinois. The company began to design and sell house kits in the mid-1890s, and in its three decades of operation, Sears made a substantial contribution to twentieth-century housing in America. One of the reasons for the popularity of Sears houses was that they consciously reflected popular American tastes of the period. During the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries, other companies offering architectural plans and kit houses emerged, including The Hodgson Company, Alladin Homes, Ray H. Bennett Lumber Company and Montgomery Ward. All shipping was done by rail, and due to the fact that Lyon Park was ideally located near several of the Washington and Old Dominion Railway stops, several mail-order houses could be easily delivered into the community.<sup>1</sup>

Numerous genuine examples of mail-order and catalog houses have been documented in Arlington County, particularly in those communities located within close proximity to Washington, D.C. and the rail lines. Commonly, builders and real estate developers purchased a plan and proceeded to erect numerous examples of the building based on the original mail-order design. Consequently, positive identification of mail-order and catalog houses during a reconnaissance survey is nearly impossible. However, at least sixteen kit houses have been identified in Lyon Park.<sup>2</sup> These include examples from the Sears, Roebuck and Company such as the Whitehall (3006 North Pershing Drive, built circa 1920), the Mount Vernon (508 North Fillmore Street, built circa 1922), the Rembrandt (315 North Garfield Street, built circa 1925),

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the Elsmore (803 North Highland Street, built circa 1920), Americus (500 North Fillmore Street, built circa 1922) and the Vallonia (920 North Garfield Street, built circa 1922).

During the 1930s and 1940s, Lyon Park expanded southwest to its present borders. A surge in residential construction between 1933 and 1940 resulted in the addition of numerous brick Colonial Revival-style buildings on the neighborhood's remaining lots. This style, which borrowed heavily from early American architecture—particularly Georgian and Federal buildings—was largely an outgrowth of a nationwide pride in the past. In the early phase, the Colonial Revival style remained the exclusive domain of fashionable architectural firms and was favored for the large residences of wealthy clients. However, as the style spread to the suburbs and increased in popularity, the detailing and form became more modest and plain. The Colonial Revival style was quickly embraced by developers and architects to meet the housing needs of suburban Arlington County in the middle part of the twentieth century. The adaptation of the style to the middle-income housing of Lyon Park resulted in three-bay-wide rectangular wood-frame or brick structures with projecting porticos, cornice returns, open pediments, and Tuscan columns. The Colonial Revival-style dwellings of Lyon Park tend to be slightly smaller in scale and plan than those of neighboring communities. Another notable distinction is the reduced stylistic ornamentation, a trend that reflected the mass production of domestic dwellings to meet the growing housing needs of the nation's capital in the 1930s and 1940s. This more modest interpretation of the Colonial Revival style is particularly visible on 1<sup>st</sup> Place North, where the two-story brick dwellings are virtually identical in plan, form, massing, material, and have limited stylistic ornamentation. Examples are located at 2629 Washington Boulevard (1928), 723 North Highland Street (1933), and 3116 1<sup>st</sup> Place North (1940).

Similarly, the one-and-a-half-story "Cape Cod" cottages of the 1930s and 1940s exhibit the familiar detailing and form commonly associated with the Colonial Revival style. This form provided an adequate and affordable housing mode for the growing population of working- and middle-class residents of Arlington County, while mimicking the fashionable style of the period. A popular form found throughout the neighborhood, the Cape Cod buildings are typically constructed of brick with side-gable roofs and front-gable dormers. The examples identified in Lyon Park typically have a central-passage plan. Detailing includes flat door surrounds with

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shallow Tuscan pilasters supporting a slightly projecting entablature, a corbeled brick cornice on the facade, and rectangular 6/6 double-hung, wood sash windows with brick sills. It was noted that in addition to the denticulated brick cornice, a carved panel was often applied over the main entry. Examples of Cape Cod dwellings are located at 3116 4<sup>th</sup> Street North (1920), 3009 2<sup>nd</sup> Street North (1935), and 3117 2<sup>nd</sup> Road North (1940).

Lyon Park is also home to a substantial number of Tudor Revival-style dwellings. As with the Queen Anne and Colonial Revival styles, many of the Tudor Revival-style resources found in Lyon Park, and Arlington County as a whole, reflect the suburbanization of the style rather than the initial high-style expression. The distinguishing features in Lyon Park include multiple-gabled roofs, the placement of an exterior brick chimney on the façade, and steeply pitched front gables. Both wood frame and brick facing are found as cladding materials on these dwellings. Examples are located at 926 North Cleveland Street (1928), 2505 4<sup>th</sup> Street North (1928), and 3122 1<sup>st</sup> Road North (1940).

By the middle of the twentieth century, domestic buildings began to be constructed on a smaller scale with more modest detailing, as reflective of the housing trends of this period. The lack of detailing on many of the houses, apartments, and commercial buildings countywide allowed for quick inexpensive construction using readily available materials. Many of these buildings are vernacular in nature and do not represent a particular style. Typically, these buildings feature brick or stone facing on the facades and weatherboard or aluminum siding on the remaining elevations. Examples are found at 2926 1<sup>st</sup> Street North (1945), 926 North Edgewood Street (1945), and 2601 2<sup>nd</sup> Road North (1960).

Many of the dwellings within Lyon Park have freestanding garages and/or sheds. These structures are typically of wood-frame or brick construction, matching the construction material of the main dwelling. By the 1920s, the dwelling and the garage were being erected simultaneously. As the influence of the automobile grew, many dwellings began to be constructed with wood-frame or brick attached garages built to one side of the main structure or built below ground with a sloping driveway and a one-story room located above.

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In addition to garages, there are a large number of sheds within the historic district. The shed, which is actually a catch-all term often applied to any storage or unidentified structure, is typically one story and constructed of wood frame or pre-fabricated metal. Although many of the properties have sheds, few of these are actually considered to be historic, most having been erected in the last quarter of the twentieth century. Other noted outbuildings include carports, gazebos, barbeque pits, guesthouses, playhouses and tree houses, and swimming pools.

Multiple dwellings also make up a substantial part of the domestic housing stock in Lyon Park, particularly near the east and south boundaries of the neighborhood. Developed in the 1930s and 1940s, these multiple dwellings include both low-rise garden apartments and twin dwellings. Many of these multiple dwellings reference the Colonial Revival style as frequently seen in buildings that were constructed during the second quarter of the twentieth century. Constructed of brick in the Colonial Revival and modern styles, the apartment complexes typically stand two to three stories in height with flat roofs. Among those erected in Lyon Park are the Irving Apartments (1932), Sheffield Apartments (1942), Lee Gardens (1942, 1949), and Lee High (1943).

Apartment development within Arlington County between 1930-1954 was dominated by the garden apartment design, part of the Garden City movement popular during this period. The apartment buildings found along the borders of Lyon Park were constructed during this period and it is obvious that the Garden City movement had an effect on their design and site layout. The idea of the Garden City movement was to create residences overlooking natural greens and to provide citizens with above-standard housing. These rental developments within Arlington County fortified the county's transformation from "scattered farmsteads to village-like clusters and subdivisions."<sup>3</sup> The garden apartment building is a structure that includes "halls or stairs used in common, which must be maintained throughout some kind or other of joint arrangement for service."<sup>4</sup> The garden apartment complex "would be comprised of three or more two- or three-story buildings with a central entrance, no lobby, and no elevators, arranged together in a landscaped setting."<sup>5</sup>

Constructed in 1932, the Irving Apartment Building at 605 North Irving Street is an excellent

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example of a low-rise garden apartment building. The twelve-bay-wide brick building stands two stories in height on a raised foundation and has a flat roof with an ornamental parapet. Colonial Revival-style detailing is found at the entries, which have fluted pilasters and pedimented hoods with brackets, window openings, and enclosed end porches. Although the apartment building consists of a single structure rather than a complex of buildings like its neighboring counterparts, the Irving Apartment Building presents many of the same garden apartment elements. These include landscaped yards, off-street parking hidden from view, and paved walkways connecting the structures and leading to the public sidewalk.

Another example of the influence of the Garden City movement on apartment buildings is Lee Gardens (1942, 1949), consisting of sixty-seven, three-story apartment buildings located on approximately thirty acres. It is located off Arlington Boulevard and 10<sup>th</sup> Street North, Washington, D.C. architect Mihran Mesrobian designed the buildings in a combination of Colonial Revival and Art Deco styles. The buildings are three stories tall with either hipped or flat roofs, and exhibit stone surrounds with broken pediments, corbeled cornices and large windows of glass blocks.

**Public Structures in Lyon Park**

In addition to the domestic architecture found throughout Lyon Park, there are also civic, religious, and commercial buildings. The residential neighborhood of Lyon Park was laid out around a central park consisting of two-and-a-half acres. A joint effort by the community, represented by the Lyon Park Community Association, and Lyon and Fitch, Inc. resulted in the construction of a community house along North Fillmore Street, on the northeast side of the park lot. The building was completed in 1925, and continues to serve the Lyon Park Community Association. The wood-frame building stands one-and-a-half stories in height on a masonry foundation. It is rectangular in form, and clad in weatherboard siding with a gabled roof. The building fronts onto North Fillmore Street with a pedimented entry at the center of the elevation.

A more prominent entry, sheltered by a portico with Tuscan posts, is located at the center of the north elevation facing the park. Colonial Revival in style, the building has Palladian-like windows, Tuscan posts, cornice returns, corner boards, and pedimented gables.

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The Virginia Avenue Christian Church (3020 North Pershing Drive), constructed in 1927-1928, is currently occupied by Christ Church of Arlington. The prominent brick building is Tudor Revival in style with a crenellated corner tower, steeply pitched gables, lancet windows, limestone coping, and skintled brickwork. The building has a Greek cross plan, augmented by the square tower at the intersection of North Pershing Drive and Virginia Avenue. The semi-circular arched windows are sectioned by shallow buttresses that interrupt the projecting brick stringcourse.

The Colonial Revival-style Temple Monte Sinai (3101 Arlington Boulevard) was built in the 1940s. The large brick building has a projecting front gable entrance, brick quoins, a cast concrete belt course and a wood cornice with returns.

Within each of the planned communities of Arlington County, smaller roads and streets that extended from the major routes into the neighborhoods were adapted for commercial use. This is particularly evident along Washington Boulevard and North Pershing Drive in Lyon Park. The purpose-built commercial buildings along these roads are one to two stories in height, constructed of brick and often clad with limestone. The larger commercial buildings, like those seen at 2626-2632 and 2645-2649 North Pershing Drive (1920), were divided into smaller, individual stores. Each store had its own entry and storefront window openings for display purposes. The second floors were generally utilized as apartments with a single-entry opening inconspicuously set in the end bay of the facades. Several of the original storefront buildings remain standing today, including the two-story buildings on the northeast and southeast corners. The perimeters of the neighborhood have since been intruded upon by commercial development that is concentrated near Arlington Boulevard and 10<sup>th</sup> Street North. The more modern commercial development dates from the latter part of the twentieth century, and includes offices, a hotel, and fast food restaurants and stores that cater more to the automobile traffic bisecting the residential neighborhood than to the pedestrians. Accordingly, these modern establishments are surrounded by large parking lots.

Constructed between 1936-1945, Whitey's Restaurant at 2761 Washington Boulevard adjoins the

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more imposing commercial building at 2645-2649 North Pershing Drive. One of the most recognized buildings in the community for its occupants rather than architectural style or scale, Whitey's Restaurant occupies one of two individual storefronts within a single brick structure. The projecting storefronts overshadow the applied architectural elements displayed in the limestone cladding, including the fluted pilasters, medallions, Tuscan pilasters, and swags. Storefront windows with fixed panes of glass and awnings flank the central entries.

**Development After 1953**

Lyon Park experienced little construction after the middle of the twentieth century as residential buildings had improved most of the interior lots by this time. A few of the remaining unimproved lots, however, have subsequently had single-family residences built on them in the last quarter of the twentieth century. For the most part these new dwellings are built in styles compatible with the historic housing stock seen throughout Lyon Park.

In the latter part of the 20<sup>th</sup> century, additions and minor alterations were made to a few of the houses in Lyon Park. The alterations included rear additions, side wings, and the enclosing of porches. The dwellings at 50 North Fenwick Street and 3004 2<sup>nd</sup> Road North are examples of dwellings with a side wing and rear addition respectively. New materials introduced include vinyl-sash windows, and aluminum and vinyl siding. An example of aluminum siding used to reclad dormers can be seen at 3101 4<sup>th</sup> Street North. Despite the alterations and minor additions that have occurred in Lyon Park, the majority of the features that illustrate the building's original style in terms of massing, spatial relationship, proportion, fenestration, texture of materials, and ornamentation are largely intact. The setback, massing, scale, and overall feeling of Lyon Park as a suburban neighborhood is significantly intact as envisioned by developer Frank Lyon in the first half of the 20<sup>th</sup> century.

Arlington Boulevard and 10<sup>th</sup> Street North, major transportation corridors through Arlington County, bound the Lyon Park community on the north, east, and south. As such, modern commercial development along these routes provides services to the neighborhood and passing automobile traffic. These modern commercial establishments, as well as the multiple-family

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development that dates to the latter part of the twentieth century, do not contribute to the context of the historic district. Located along the edge of the boundary, they are not recommended for inclusion in the proposed district.

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**STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**

Lyon Park is an excellent example of one of the many residential subdivisions that emerged in Arlington County after the First World War to support the burgeoning population flocking to the nation's capital and its suburbs. The middle-class suburban community, framed by major transportation corridors, is primarily tied to the arrival of commuter railways that provided convenient daily access from the Arlington suburb to Washington, D.C. The development continued to expand with the advent of the streetcar and the population's growing reliance on the automobile. Lyon Park was the first of several suburbs in Arlington County platted by speculative developer Frank Lyon. Although containing some earlier buildings, the neighborhood developed primarily over the several decades between 1919 and 1953, under the direction of Lyon and Fitch, Incorporated, which was later renamed Lyon Properties, Incorporated. Lyon Park, as designed by engineer and landscape architect William Sunderman, contained sloping and flat lots available with or without trees, along both curving and grid-pattern streets, all expanding out from a central community park. The original subdivision of Lyon Park was smaller than the present neighborhood and was expanded to the east, south and west between 1920 and 1953. The chronological development of the current Lyon Park neighborhood is documented by its architecture, which includes a range of construction dates from 1891 up to the infill construction in the latter part of the twentieth century. Varying from large two-and-a-half-story brick dwellings to smaller wood bungalows, the neighborhood is generally defined by its eclectic collection of Queen Anne, Craftsman, Colonial Revival and Tudor Revival style residences. Each style, as represented in Lyon Park, reflects the suburbanization of the style rather than the initial high-style expression. As a whole, the early twentieth-century suburb of Lyon Park achieved significance as a planned residential community developed between 1891 and 1953. Furthermore, the earlier residences scattered throughout Lyon Park document the early development of Arlington at the turn of the twentieth century.

The district meets National Register criteria A and C, and is significant under the themes of architecture and community planning/development with the period of significance extending from 1891 to 1953. The neighborhood consists of 978 properties including 894 single dwellings, 49 multiple dwellings, 3 churches, 19 commercial buildings, one community center, one park, and 515 secondary resources such as garages and sheds. In all, there are 1,171 contributing resources and 322 non-contributing resources.

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**Criterion A: That are associated with events that have made a significant contribution to the broad patterns of our history.**

Lyon Park meets Criterion A of the National Register of Historic Places as a planned community that developed to support the expanding middle-class suburban population of Washington, D.C. during the first and second quarters of the twentieth century. This early commuting suburb was originally served by the Great Falls and Old Dominion Railroad, which cut across northern Arlington and provided easy access for commuters between Great Falls and Rosslyn. By 1912, the Bluemont branch of the Washington and Old Dominion Railway was laid along the route of present-day U.S. Interstate 66. The double-track line ran from Bluemont Junction near Glencarlyn to Thrifton Junction (now Lyon Village Shopping Center). The route, which traveled across the Aqueduct Bridge by a single track into Washington, D.C., included thirty-five stops in Arlington. Similarly, by 1924, the Washington-Virginia Railway Co. (formerly the Washington, Alexandria and Mount Vernon line) had a total of sixty-four stops in Arlington.

The increasing acceptance of the automobile and the need for efficient transportation routes into the District of Columbia dictated the 1932 construction of the Memorial Bridge and the opening of the George Washington Memorial Highway. In turn this led to the abandonment of the Great Falls and Old Dominion Electric Railway in 1935, which historically had been the area's fastest mode of transportation.<sup>1</sup> Within easy reach of these major transportation corridors, Lyon Park was firmly established as a commuting suburb of Washington, D.C. by 1950.

**Criterion C: That embody the distinctive characteristics of a type, period, or method of construction or that represent the work of a master, or that possess high artistic values, or that represent a significant and distinguishable entity whose components may lack individual distinction.**

The suburban neighborhood of Lyon Park meets Criterion C of the National Register of Historic Places for its substantial concentration of domestic architecture of the early twentieth century, representing the Queen Anne, Craftsman, Colonial Revival, Tudor Revival, Art Deco and Moderne styles that were popular during the period. The majority

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of the residences were speculatively designed by local builders and architects, including Frederick E. Westenberger and Keith A. Brumback. The earliest houses erected within the original Lyon Park subdivision generally represented the Queen Anne and Craftsmen styles. As the neighborhood continued to grow, Colonial Revival and Tudor Revival became the prominent styles. The majority of the dwellings are set back from the street and were later augmented by sun-porches, side wings, rear ells, and attached garages.

As the population of Arlington grew, residential construction in Lyon Park increased in the 1920s and 1930s and house sizes and stylistic features began to change in response to a new clientele. Consequently, a substantial number of new houses were built within the original borders of the neighborhood, as well as in the additional sections that had been added to Lyon Park. The dwellings were modest with minimal ornamentation and many of them were products of mail-order companies or local realty enterprises that offered modest foursquare buildings, Cape Cods and bungalows ornamented in a variety of styles, including Tudor Revival, Craftsman, and Colonial Revival.

Additional residential development occurred to the east and south of the original neighborhoods during the 1940s. Various public works programs, operating from Washington, D.C. during the Great Depression followed by the need for an increased work force during World War II, led to a population surge in Washington, D.C. that spilled over to the suburbs. In order to meet the needs of the population, multiple dwellings began to be constructed. Within Lyon Park, large-scale apartment complexes and rows of twin dwellings were constructed in order to meet the increased housing demand. By the mid-1950s, the Lyon Park neighborhood was complete. In the latter part of the 20<sup>th</sup> century, additions and minor alterations were made to a few of the buildings in Lyon Park. These changes do not diminish the overall integrity of the historic district, or the integrity of any individual building. When the additions substantially altered the original form, scale, and fenestration of the building, it was noted as non-contributing. Typically, the additions are sensitive to the original design, workmanship, materials, and feeling of Lyon Park as it was initially developed and has continued to evolve as a suburb of Washington, D.C.

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**HISTORIC BACKGROUND**

*Arlington County*

Arlington County is a twenty-six-square-mile community located in Northern Virginia along the Potomac River, across from Washington, D.C. The county is bounded by Fairfax County to the north and west, the town of Alexandria and Four Mile Run to the south, and the waters of the Potomac River to the east. The county's association with the nation's capital began as early as 1791, when Virginia ceded approximately thirty-one square miles of land, now known as Arlington County and the city of Alexandria as the site for the nation's capital. Forty-one-foot-square sandstone markers were erected in 1791-1792 at one-mile intervals marking the District of Columbia boundary. Major Andrew Ellicott was the chief surveyor, assisted by Benjamin Banneker, an astronomer, and others. Ten of these stones still mark the boundary of Arlington, although one of them has been moved from its original location.

At the time of the founding of the nation's capital, Arlington was still a small crossroads community with only scattered development within the environs. Andrew Ellicott commented on Arlington's rural character on June 26, 1791 in the "Surveyors Camp, State of Virginia:"

"The country through which we are now cutting one of the ten-mile lines is very poor. I think for near seven miles, on it there is not one house that has any floor except the earth, and what is more strange is it is in the neighborhood of Alexandria and Georgetown..."<sup>2</sup>

When Virginia officially ceded the land in 1801, the population of the country was 5,949 with all but 978 living in the Town of Alexandria.<sup>3</sup> It was during this period that Arlington ceased to be under the jurisdiction of Virginia and Fairfax County and became part of the County of Alexandria of the District of Columbia. With the introduction of a circuit court, orphan's court and levy court, the town of Alexandria became the seat of local government, and the commercial and social center for the thirty-one square miles ceded by Virginia. Referred to as the "country part" of the county, Arlington remained rural with agricultural interests. The land was improved and maintained by just a few large plantations throughout this period, most notably the Alexander-Custis plantation

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known as Abingdon, and the Custis-Lee house known as Arlington. The remainder of the cultivated land was primarily made up of small plots held by farmers and tenants.

Although the population of the Arlington area continued to increase in the early nineteenth century, the majority of the county's population remained concentrated in the town of Alexandria. Of the 8,552 who lived in the county in 1810, only 1,325 lived in the rural part of the county. By 1820, the rural population had increased by only 160 persons with a total of 1,485 of the 9,703 total county residents living outside town limits.<sup>4</sup>

The ties of the Arlington area to Washington, D.C. were physically manifested with the construction of bridges that replaced the ferries of colonial times. The first bridge to cross the Potomac River into Arlington was located at the site of the current Chain Bridge. The new bridges, and Arlington's proximity to Alexandria, resulted in the development of local turnpike companies and several turnpikes running west to Leesburg.<sup>5</sup>

Alexandria County, including the city of Alexandria and Arlington, was returned to the Commonwealth of Virginia following a referendum among its citizens in 1846-1847. Alexandria remained the area's center of commerce, trade, and domestic development, spurred on by the construction of canals, railroads, and trading routes. Improved roadways and the railroad further encouraged commercial prosperity by providing the necessary links between farms and commercial centers. The railroads, however, did not cross the river until after the Civil War (1861-1865), when Union forces laid rails along Long Bridge.<sup>6</sup>

In the decades leading up to the Civil War, the population of Alexandria County, continued to grow with 9,573 residents in 1830. By 1840, the population had increased by only 394 residents. The 1850 census shows a steady increase to 10,008 and to 12,652 in 1860. Those living in the rural part of the county in this period remained in the minority, numbering 1,332 residents in 1830 and 1,508 residents in 1840, with a decline to 1,274 residents in 1850.<sup>7</sup> Most of those employed in rural areas were listed in the census of 1850 as farmers or laborers, although other professions included teachers, merchants, papermakers, carpenters, millers, shoemakers, clerks, tollgate keepers, blacksmiths, and clergymen.

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New farms continued to be developed in the Arlington area throughout the early to mid-nineteenth century. Attracted by a less industrial way of life and the availability of good inexpensive land, a number of new residences from New England and the Middle Atlantic states settled in the vicinity. Many of the residents erected dwelling houses in the county, although not all buildings were constructed as permanent residences. Providing a holiday from the sweltering heat of the District of Columbia swamps, the ridge of rural Arlington was home to a number of summer cottages and hunting lodges.<sup>8</sup>

On May 23-24, 1861, Federal troops entered Virginia in order to protect Washington City during the Civil War. Additional forts were erected throughout the Arlington area in order to provide additional support to the standing forts at the low-lying edges of the river crossings. By 1862, twenty-three forts, most of them located in Arlington, had been constructed on the south bank of the Potomac River, and about 10,000 Union troops occupied these forts during the course of the Civil War, overwhelming the 1,486 residents of Arlington.<sup>9</sup>

During the occupation, the residents of Alexandria County suffered, Union and Confederate sympathizers alike. The economic base of the county declined as residents were circumscribed by heavy military traffic. Depredation of Alexandria County citizens by the troops was common, as was the appropriation of land and buildings in the "necessity of public interest."<sup>10</sup> Certainly the most famous illustration of this occupation was the Union possession of the Custis-Lee family mansion known as Arlington House, which was used as the headquarters of the commanding general. Although every effort was made at first to protect the property of the Lee family, who had vacated the site when Robert E. Lee took command of Virginia's Confederate troops in 1861, many articles of furniture disappeared. Inevitably, the grounds suffered because of the large number of men encamped there. After the First and Second Battles of Manassas, many wounded troops, including Confederates, were brought to Arlington House. Many of the dead were buried on the estate near the house; thus establishing Arlington National Cemetery (officially founded in 1864).

With the end of hostilities, the Arlington area was left in disarray. The Union troops disbanded, leaving in their wake abandoned forts and ruined farmland. The presence of the forts and troops during the Civil War had also brought unwanted elements that

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remained in Arlington after the Civil War. Gambling dens, saloons, and brothels grew up in the Rosslyn area, along the route that farmers trading in Washington, D.C. and children schooled in Washington, D.C. had to take. Protected by a corrupt local government and supported by a Washington, D.C. clientele, they were difficult to close down. The presence of these criminal elements held back the development and settlement of the Arlington area. However, Arlington was able to recover and within thirty years after the Civil War, Arlington County doubled in population and there was an increase in the number of farms.<sup>11</sup>

It was during this period that lawyer and speculative developer Frank Lyon and his wife, Georgie Hays Wright moved to a modest dwelling on Lubber Lane in Alexandria County. Frank Lyon was born in Petersburg, Virginia on December 30, 1867. Lyon moved to Washington, D.C. to work for the Southern Railroad in 1886, and in 1887, Lyon became the private secretary to Walter L. Bragg of Alabama, a commissioner with the newly formed Interstate Commerce Commission (ICC), a position he maintained until 1899. While working for the ICC, Lyon attended Georgetown University Law School, receiving a master of law degree in 1890. In 1902, after spending two years as a stenographer for the Constitutional Convention of Virginia, Lyon began to practice law and formed a partnership with Robert Moore. Moore introduced Frank Lyon to the real estate business and together they began to purchase large tracts of developable land in Arlington County. However, the area's reputation as the home of saloons, gambling houses, brothels, and frequent violence, particularly in the area know as Rosslyn and the present site of the Pentagon, prevented many newcomers or speculative developers from investing in the area.

In the 1890s, a Citizen's League was formed in order to rid the area of these unwanted elements. Frank Lyon joined and became one of the leading members in their crusade. To further the beliefs of the League, as well as his own real estate interests, Lyon purchased the *Alexandria County Monitor*, a local newspaper that was initially published by the *Falls Church Monitor*.<sup>12</sup> Together, the Citizen's League and Lyon battled against the numerous illegal gambling dens. The owners were brought to court but no one was willing to testify against them. In order to secure a conviction, the prosecutors allowed the juror to visit the sites and place bets themselves. A number of convictions resulted and the betting parlours and gambling dens were closed.<sup>13</sup> The league then turned its attention to the numerous saloons and brothels. Frank Lyon was chosen to represent the

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dry forces and found a legislative clause stating that liquor licenses could not be granted in Arlington without sufficient police protection. At the time the police force consisted of only one sheriff and one deputy. On April 29, 1905, petitions were filled for liquor licenses and Frank Lyon successfully argued for their denial.<sup>14</sup> The unlawful elements had been removed from Arlington and the area was ready for development.

*The Platting of Lyon Park*

Between 1910 and 1919, Frank Lyon and his law partner R. Walton Moore purchased about 300 acres of land to develop as an extension to Clarendon, which was platted as "Moore's Addition 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7 to Clarendon."<sup>15</sup> Clarendon, platted in 1900 by Bostonian Robert Treat Paine, Jr., consisted of twenty-five acres of land near the intersection of what was then the Falls Church-Georgetown Road (now Wilson Boulevard) and the Washington, Arlington & Falls Church Electric Railway line (today the path of Washington Boulevard).<sup>16</sup> Moore, who later became involved in politics, eventually sold his interest in "Moore's Additions" to Frank Lyon.<sup>17</sup> In 1919, Frank Lyon platted 102 acres of the property as Lyon Park. William F. Sunderland, landscape architect and engineer, designed the plan for Lyon Park, laying out the fifty-foot lots along straight and curving streets. Sunderland also developed Frank Lyon's second development in Arlington, known as Lyon Village. Within the heart of the 102-acre development, two-and-a-half acres of land were set aside for use as a public park. At the intersection of North Pershing Drive and Washington Boulevard, commercial development was encouraged to provide shopping for the residents.

Lyon and Fitch, Inc., founded by Frank Lyon in 1920, oversaw the development of the neighborhood. C. Walton Fitch, a graduate of Cornell University, oversaw the land sales for the company. Charles W. Smith, Lyon's son-in-law and law partner, served as treasurer. Lawrence Michael was a salesman for the firm who later went on to become president of the company. The stated purpose of Lyon and Fitch, Inc. was "to buy, sell, improve, develop, lease and exchange real estate, to borrow money, make and secure same on real estate; to build sewers, and to provide and construct all other betterments and facilities; to contract for the contracting business; to subdivide real estate into lots, parks, streets, and alleys, and to sell or dedicate the same to the use of the public..."<sup>18</sup>

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As a real estate developer, Lyon's personal attitude regarding liquor was forced upon prospective buyers. Every deed of sale clearly stated that "liquor shall never be sold or dispensed on the property or from any building erected thereon, nor shall said property be used for the conducting of any business that constitutes a nuisance to other lot owners in the subdivision, such as a soap factory or like industry." Covenants regarding the prospective residents and the cost of the buildings to be constructed in the suburb were also included in the deeds of sale, which stated, "neither said property nor any part thereof nor any interest therein shall be sold or leased to any one not of the Caucasian race, nor shall any house costing less than \$2,000 other than an outbuilding, be erected thereon."<sup>19</sup>

A 1920 promotional brochure, produced by the real estate company highlighted the amenities offered by Lyon Park such as natural shade, pure water, clean sewers, gas, electricity, cement sidewalks, mail by carrier, playgrounds and parks.<sup>20</sup> The death of one of Lyon's sons from a fever contracted from a polluted stream appears to have been the driving influence in the requirement that good water and sewer drainage be provided for the neighborhood's residents.

In the 1920s, building sites in Lyon Park cost between \$350 and \$500, and a minimum of two lots were sold to any single buyer. Lyon and Fitch oversaw the construction of some of the houses, but the majority were constructed specifically for the buyers. A six-room house set on four lots cost about \$9,000. The designs of dwellings erected by private owners were subject to review by the real estate firm's architects.<sup>21</sup>

One of the main selling points emphasized in the promotional literature was the existence of a central community park. The two-and-a-half acres of land set aside as a public park is bounded today by North Pershing Drive, North Fillmore Street, North 4<sup>th</sup> Street, and North Garfield Street, and in 1920, contained a natural grove of trees and a large spring. A plan of the park, which accompanied the advertisements, showed proposed meandering walkways, a lake, springhouse, picnic tables, and a community center. Although the lake was never realized, the community center was erected in 1925. Lyon and Fitch, Inc. donated \$500 towards the construction of a community center, not to exceed construction costs of \$2,000. The Lyon Park Citizen's Association oversaw construction of the community house. Funds were collected from the neighborhood and individuals who donated \$25 or more became life-time members of the Lyon Park Community Center

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Committee. The committee's motto in their original constitution read: "A social, civic and recreative center; so democratic as to attract the humblest; so wholesome as to appeal to the exclusive; so broad in scope as to bring youth, maturity and old age into closer companionship to the benefit of all."<sup>22</sup> By the winter of 1924, construction had begun but was halted because of rising construction costs. A fair, held in the summer of 1925, raised the \$800 needed for the completion of the building.

The Lyon Park Community Association has continuously owned the building and maintained the surrounding parkland.<sup>23</sup> The building served many purposes in the history of the community. The Lyon Park Community Center Committee and the Lyon Park Citizen's Association sponsored dances and community fund-raisers at the community center. The center also was used by neighborhood and county-wide organizations, such as a meeting hall for local churches waiting for permanent buildings, and the Lyon Park Women's Club (formed 1924), which worked to improve social conditions in the Lyon Park neighborhood.

Another selling point of Lyon Park was its accessibility to the commuter trains running from Arlington to Washington, D.C. These commuter trains and streetcars provided an inexpensive, reliable form of transportation for people living in the growing suburbs of Arlington, and were often used by real estate developers to attract residents. In 1920, Lyon and Fitch advertised the transportation amenities afforded prospective residents of Lyon Park:

"Elevation 260 feet above Washington – three miles west of White House. One mile west of Arlington Amphitheater...Macadam Road to Georgetown via Key Bridge, and to Potomac Park via Military Road through Fort Myer, Arlington and Highway Bridge. Falls Church cars of Washington-Virginia Railway from 12<sup>th</sup> and Pennsylvania Avenue reach property in twenty minutes. Also cars via Georgetown and Rosslyn. Commutation rates."<sup>24</sup>

These commuter trains encouraged government workers, based in Washington, D.C., to relocate to the Virginia suburbs. According to the 1920 U. S. Census, the majority of the first residents who purchased lots in Lyon Park came from Washington, D.C. and other parts of Virginia. Many of them were employed by the U.S. government as clerks,

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bookkeepers, stenographers and secretaries. Other jobs held by the residents in 1920 include teachers, salesmen, butchers, plumbers, chauffeurs and printers.<sup>25</sup>

Development within the original boundaries of Lyon Park was completed by 1922. During the 1920s and 1930s, Frank Lyon continued to expand his development by purchasing and platting land to the east, south, and west of the original development.<sup>26</sup> These purchases more than doubled the size of the development from 102 acres to 215. The Great Depression suppressed the extensive building rate during the late 1920s and early 1930s. Therefore, construction in Lyon Park did not begin on many of these new portions until the mid-1930s. Some of the new lots became home to a number of single-family residences, but most of the newly acquired land was subdivided for multiple dwellings.

**Garden Apartments, Apartment Houses and Apartment Complexes: 1934-1954**

The explosion of the population in the Washington, D.C. metropolitan area between 1934 and 1954 as a result of the federal government's New Deal programs, increasing need for wartime workers and return of World War II veterans, led to a crippling housing shortage throughout the area.<sup>27</sup> Arlington County, its rural landscape soon to be an image from the past, became one of the fastest developing counties in the Washington, D.C. metropolitan area.<sup>28</sup> The number of Arlingtonians continued to grow, with the population reaching 26,615 residents in 1930. This number more than doubled ten years later with a total of 57,040 residents in 1940. Of those employed in 1940, more than 40% were involved with the government on a local, state, and federal basis. These workers, who made up the largest group of families and individuals in need of rental housing, spurred the government to become involved in housing developments. "Increased rentals for...apartment units..., coming in the wake of the largest federal payrolls since the World War (I), were the primary reason for the great revival of...building. Thousands of new employees of the New Deal agencies rapidly took up the slack in residential space, causing rentals to increase 25 percent and more."<sup>29</sup> The Federal Housing Administration (FHA), established in 1934, became the primary mortgage insurers for thousands of residential projects, both single-family and multiple dwellings, throughout the United States. The FHA's involvement in Arlington County directly impacted a number of the large apartment complexes that would be constructed in the county between 1934-1954. The county's location along the banks of the Potomac River across from Washington,

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D.C. attracted a number of developers with FHA-insured mortgages to construct these large-scale housing projects. Where the FHA was not directly involved, it influenced the designs and layouts of hundreds of the complexes and individual apartments being built in Arlington County. The dramatic increase in population during the 1930s and the limited availability of affordable rental housing for middle-class government workers made the county a prime development area.

The beginning of World War II in Europe in 1939 turned the FHA's focus to defense housing. In Arlington County, the population jumped from approximately 57,000 in 1940 to 120,000 in 1944. The FHA Large Housing Division turned its attention to the development of more low-rent housing for the burgeoning defense requirements in the metropolitan area and throughout the United States. In order to encourage this type of housing by private developers, the FHA lowered its minimum construction, design and property requirements. Once the United States entered the war in December 1941, low-cost housing for wartime workers was essential, especially in the Washington, D.C. metropolitan area with the severe housing shortages. Changes that were adopted by the FHA to stimulate this development included the omission of service walks, a main exterior entrance and front stairs, the elimination of garages, and the construction of longer buildings.<sup>30</sup>

The extensive housing shortage in Washington, D.C. led to the construction of 176 new apartment buildings or complexes in Arlington County between 1934 and 1954 to house these new middle-class residents. During the late 1930s and particularly the war years of the forties, new construction was nearly entirely devoted to the construction of twin dwellings and apartments. Lyon Park, in particular, became home to three large apartment complexes as well as many smaller apartment buildings, and streets of twin dwellings. All these multiple dwellings were built on the newly acquired property along the outskirts of the neighborhood. By 1945, the growing community of Lyon Park had expanded to 10<sup>th</sup> Street North to the north, Arlington Boulevard to the east and south, and North Irving Street to the west, with apartment complexes and commercial development along the borders.

The construction of these new apartments ended in 1944, and once again development stopped. Lyon Park, as we know it today, was completed by 1953 with two additional

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purchases of land along Arlington Boulevard. These small additions were divided for single-family residences, a school, and park.

*Lyon Park Post-1953*

Lyon Park continues to be a major residential suburb of Washington, D.C., providing easily accessible transportation, shopping, religious and educational facilities, and community activities. A few of the modest single-family dwellings were renovated in the latter part of the 20<sup>th</sup> century to better accommodate the growing population. The alterations included rear additions, side wings, and the enclosing of porches. New materials introduced include vinyl-sash windows, and aluminum and vinyl siding. However, despite the alterations and minor additions that have occurred in Lyon Park, and throughout the Metropolitan Washington area, the majority of the features that illustrate the building's original style in terms of massing, spatial relationship, proportion, pattern of windows and doors, texture of materials, and ornamentation are largely intact. When determining the contributing/non-contributing status of these altered buildings, it was determined that small-scale additions to the side and rear of the buildings did not diminish the appearance of the original design, massing or proportion of the historic structure. It was also determined that the replacement of wood-sash windows with vinyl-sash windows, or the replacement of weatherboard with vinyl siding also did not detract from the original design, massing, proportion, or ornamentation. As the form, significant features, and detailing of the buildings located within the Lyon Park neighborhood are visible and not obscured, they were considered to be contributing resources to the historic district.

### Verbal Boundary Description

Lyon Park is located in central Arlington County, Virginia. It is set to the south of the Clarendon Commercial District and lies between the Ashton Heights neighborhood to the west and Fort Myer to the east. The neighborhood is nestled between 10<sup>th</sup> Street North to the north and Arlington Boulevard to the south. Arlington Boulevard also forms the eastern boundary of the district and from there the neighborhood extends westward to North Irving Street. The Lyon Park Historic District occupies approximately 284 acres.

### Boundary Justification

The boundaries of Lyon Park Historic District encompass the original 1919 Lyon Park neighborhood as well as adjacent properties to the north, south, east, and west developed as additions to Lyon Park between 1936 and 1951. These additions all continue the development of the original plan designed by William Sunderman. As a result, these properties are included in the historic district.

The southern- and eastern-most boundaries of the historic district lie along Arlington Boulevard. The post-1922 additions to Lyon Park lie between the original 102 acres to the west and north, and Arlington Boulevard to the east and south. Arlington Boulevard, also known as Lee Boulevard and U.S. Route 50, was completed along the south and east border of Lyon Park by the mid-1930s, separating Lyon Park from other residential neighborhoods developed on the southern side of the road, and from Fort Myer to the east. This road continues to be a major commuter route into Washington, D.C. for the residents of Lyon Park. A new commercial building located on the south corner of North Pershing Drive and Arlington Boulevard, the apartment complex on North Bedford Street, and the school board facilities located a block from Arlington Boulevard on North Fillmore Street, were constructed after 1951. These properties, as well as a few

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individual properties not contributing to the period of significance, have been excluded from the historic district.

North Irving Street is the primary western boundary of the Lyon Park Historic District. It marks the edge of Frank Lyon's 1951 development. The original 1919 plat of Lyon Park depicts a portion of the neighborhood between 2<sup>nd</sup> Road North and North Pershing Drive extending to North Irving Street. Between 1936 and 1951, Frank Lyon extended the neighborhood's northern boundaries to 10<sup>th</sup> Street North and its southern boundaries to Arlington Boulevard. Along this western boundary are a few new dwellings that have been constructed on the sites of demolished historic resources and/or previously unimproved lots. As these modern buildings are not consistent with the neighboring historic resources in form, ornament, or scale, they have been excluded from the district.

The northernmost boundary of the district is situated along 10<sup>th</sup> Street North. Today, 10<sup>th</sup> Street North serves as a major thoroughfare, connecting with Arlington Boulevard at the northeast corner of Lyon Park. Due to the increased use of 10<sup>th</sup> Street North, many new commercial buildings and multiple dwellings have been built, resulting in the demolition of a number of historic resources. These modern buildings, erected during the last half of the twentieth century, have been excluded from the historic district, as they are not compatible with the contributing resources within the Lyon Park Historic District.


